## About Scott and Hawkins:

In 1917, Elmer Scott founded The Civic Federation of Dallas as a commidleit spocial service agency. Under Mr. Scott's leadership, the Federation presented lectures, socials, dramas, and musical evenings. When the Federation was dissolved in 1958, three bodirectors assigned its assets to SMU and asked that the annual income be used for the Bacottins Lectures. Gaynell Hawkins was a 1917 graduate of SMU. Upon graduation, she began working for the Civic Federation, first as research secretary atter laducational director. She moved on to other projects in 1940 and upon her retirement in 1965 she received the SMU Woman of Achievement Award.
