

MINOR IN ENVIRONMENTAL ANTHROLOGY

DEPARTMENT OF ANTHROLOGY

The 15-hour minor in Environmental Anthropology provides students with a foundation in human-environment relationships and exposure to related environmental challenges in the past, present, and future. In addition to three core classes, students will select relevant environmental electives from existing courses in ANTH and/or related departments. At least 9 credit hours must be taken at or above the 3000 level.

Students may not take more than 3 hours between the Environmental Anthropology minor and the Environmental Studies program in Earth Sciences. Students pursuing a major in Anthropology may not take more than 3 hours between the Environmental Anthropology minor and the Anthropology major.
